

Conflict Minerals Policy - statement

To put a stop to human suffering and to reduce the environmental impact associated with mining in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and adjoining countries, the U.S. government demands traceability of the origin of 3TG minerals in accordance with the U.S. Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010 (Dodd-Frank Act), and reporting to the SEC (U.S. Securities and Exchange Commission) began in 2014.

HYTOR's values are based on quality and ethics as defined in our HSEQ policies and Code of Conduct. Therefore, HYTOR supports the intents and objectives established in the U.S. Conflict Minerals legislation. HYTOR will, as a downstream company, work aggressively and systematically towards a supply chain free from Conflict Minerals originating from the Democratic Republic of the Congo and adjoining countries by implementing policies and processes in our existing management system to align our suppliers with a conflict-free minerals policy.

HYTOR will prefer suppliers using only Conflict Minerals originating from smelters and refiners listed in the Conflict-Free Smelter Program (CFSP) and acknowledged as conflict-free by the CFSI (Conflict-Free Sourcing Initiative).
